

#### LITERACY BUDDIES


Literacy Buddies provide literacy interventions to students to support classroom curriculum.

For the month of February, the CEA kicked off Black History Month participating in World Read Aloud Day. Through this initiative, the CEA joined millions around the globe to celebrate the

power of reading aloud. World Read Aloud Day is held annually on the first Wednesday of every February. A virtual read aloud of the book "Undefeated" by Kwame Alexander was posted on both the CEA Instagram and Facebook pages. The CEA was also recognized for its Instagram World Read aloud video post and was selected from thousands of posts around the world as a winner of the Lit World (international organizers of World Read Aloud Day) book giveaway using the hashtags #DogmanGiveaway and #WorldReadAloudDay! An autographed copy of the book, "Dogman: Grime and Punishment" by Dav Pilkey was gifted to one of our extremely engaged social media students for their participation in the March literacy-inspired social media challenge.





#### KIDZ KORNER

Since the implementation of distance learning and virtual worship, the CEA has remained committed to providing weekly Kidz Korner virtual Sunday School lessons, follow up sessions and activities to engage our NMOBC and community youth. Through both our Instagram and Facebook social media pages, students and parents can access mini Bible videos and follow up questions from the lesson every Sunday following the NMOBC 9 am worship service.

Each Sunday Bible lesson includes an interactive activity that is followed up during the CEA #WednesdayWITNESS session. ## NATIONAL POETRY MONTH

RISE. SHINE. AND SING!


This April, the CEA closed out the 2nd quarter with a monthlong tribute to the art of poetry during National Poetry Month. National Poetry Month is a celebration of poetry which takes place each April. It was introduced in 1996 and is organized by the Academy of American Poets as a way to increase awareness and appreciation of poetry in the United States.

The celebration commenced with an ode to author and poet, Maya Angelou, who's birthday took place at the beginning of April. The CEA also shared a video of Inaugural National Youth Poet Laureate, Amanda Gorman, reading her

poem, "Talking Gets Us There."

The second week of April featured an overview of the traditional Japanese poet form, haiku with poems by Richard Wright and Sonia Sanchez. The CEA also commemorated Earth Day (April 17th) with poetry illustrating the beauty of Mother Earth, nature, and seasons with poems by Langston Hughes, Lucille Clifton and Nikki Giovanni. Online participants were encouraged to share illustrations created to represent each poem.

As a final contribution to our Nation Poetry Month initiative, Inspirational Poetry; poetry that inspired other works of art such as the poem "Lift Every Voice and Sing," was shared. This pivotal poet in history went on to become the Black National Anthem 30 years after being written. Finally, a video presentation of CEA students from our schools and virtual community reciting "Hey Black Child" was presented to further inspire our youth to express themselves through poetry, art and other literary works.

#### FSA TESTING 2021

With the emergence of COVID-19 in early 2020, Broward Schools was faced with the cancellation of the Florida Standardized Assessment (FSA) for all students. This school year, with Broward School safety protocols in place, including hybrid learning and socially distanced classroom setup, schools were able to plan and prepare students for this year's FSA testing season. In support of student success in not only testing, but overall academic achievement, the CEA featured a book from one of its local children's book authors, Dr. Sherrie Poitier-Liscombe to send some testing encouragement to students.

"The Adventures of Sherrie and Chubbie: School is Cool...Attendance Matters," was featured on the CEA social media pages promoting how the virtue of pursuing education as a key component to success. This book stresses the importance of attendance and how it impacts achievement not only on class work, but on standardized tests.
